



Maintenance Guide - Laminate Flooring

One of the many benefits of Laminate flooring is that it's hygenic and easy to clean and maintain.

General Cleaning

To keep your flooring looking brand new, you should remove daily dirt by sweeping, vacuuming and wiping with a clean, damp cloth. This will help prevent any loose dirt and debris from scratching your flooring, whilst also keeping it looking it's best! To remove dirty footprints from your flooring all you will need is a damp mop, however please note that damp cleaning should only be done occasionally. Ensure that your mop is not too wet and always ring out excess water before use, a microfibre mop is recommended. For regular cleaning, the use of 'soap-free' cleaners is perfect to keep your floor looking like new.

Maintenance & Up-Keep

It is important to carry out appropriate maintenance procedures to help preserve the appearance and extend the life of your laminate flooring. If the flooring is laid in an area with heavy foot traffic then more frequent maintenance would be required.



Furniture & Laminate Flooring

Consideration of external conditions can prevent damage to the flooring and also cuts down on cleaning time.

Dirt is most commonly transported indoors by foot traffic and if any dirt gets trapped under sliding furniture the flooring could suffer scratches from the abrasion of the dirt. We advise using <u>protective felt pads</u> on furniture feet to help prevent any unwanted damage. If your laminate flooring has suffered damage such as scratch marks then our <u>floor repair kit</u> is great to help remove these! Entrance mats

Reduce the risk of slips and falls while also preventing unwanted soiling to your floor with the use of entrance mats. When properly serviced, entrance mats can effectively remove abrasive materials and reduce tracking in water from foot traffic to help keep your laminate flooring clean and mark-free.

- Avoid using entrance mats that have rubber or latex backing/edging as this may cause staining.
- Regular cleaning of your entrance mat and the area surrounding it is strongly advised.

IMPORTANT TO NOTE:

To ensure optimum maintenance and care, we would advise that the following advice be followed:

- Wiping up any accidental spills as quickly as possible will help minimise the chance of staining.
- Do not use a steam mop or steam cleaning appliances when cleaning your laminate floor.
- Take caution after mopping the floors as wet laminate can become slippery.
- Avoid using abrasive cleaning equipment or floor wax on your laminate flooring.



How to repair your laminate floor from scuffs, scratches and cracks:

We understand that accidents can happen causing potential damage to your laminate flooring, such as scuffs or scratches. Our <u>Universal Repair Kit</u> quickly repairs scratches, cracks and other damage on laminate or real wood flooring.



The repair kit contains 5 different colour pots that are designed to match general wood and laminate effects, allowing you to mix and create unlimited shades to ensure you get the closest match for your floor. The kit includes a handy formula guide to help you mix the most common colours, however please note that this may not match the specific finish of your flooring.

Below are some handy steps on how to use our Universal Repair Kit.

- 1. Read through the provided formula guide to find out what mix of colours you will need to closelt match your flooring.
- 2. Using the spoon provided in the kit, add the desired measure of each required colour to the empty pot and mix.
- 3. Once you are happy with the colour you have created, carefully scoop out a small amount and using a blunt knife or spatula place this over the damaged area.
- 4. Smooth over the area until you are satisfied that the scratch or scuff is fully covered.
- 5. The putty style formula will not provide a gloss or oiled finish but will help to disguise the appearance of minor damage.
- 6. Please do not sand down excess as this could cause further scratching and damage to your flooring,
